

# Mad Grandad's Flying Saucer

Make your own collage, **Spacescape with Mad Grandad and the Flying Saucer**. You can do this on your own, or make it a class collage by asking your friends to help.

You will need:

- Black sugar paper for background
- Tinfoil and silver glitter
- Coloured paper scraps and a cup or beaker (to make circle shapes)
- PVA glue, paste brush, scissors
- White paints and/or chalk

**Step 1** Decide on the size of your background. Do you want to make a small spacescape or a larger one? Choose your background paper accordingly.

**Step 2** Make your planets – you can include as many planets from the solar system as you choose. Trace circles using your beaker and glue on colourful paper scraps to make each planet.

**Step 3** In a saucer-shape, place and then glue pieces of tinfoil on your spacescape. You can make the flying saucer as big or as small as you like, depending on how clearly you want Mad Grandad and Lenny to appear.


**Step 4** Make easy six-pointed stars. Brighten up your spacescape even more with some stars. Anyone can make a star shape: on a separate piece of paper draw two triangles, each roughly the same size. Using chalks, glitter, paint or all three, colour these triangles. When dry, cut out both triangles and glue one point-up on the spacescape, then overlap and glue the other triangle point-down over the first triangle. Repeat as often as you like.



In *Mad Grandad and the Flying Saucer*, Lenny and his Grandad see lots of satellites in space. See how many words can you make from the word **satellite**.
