



WHO AM I?

Here are some definitions of well-known garden birds.
See if you can name each bird.

- ▶ This is a familiar garden bird with a rounded shape and longish legs. It can be fiercely territorial and may be quite violent even against its own kind. The male gets its famous red breast when it reaches maturity.

- ▶ This bird is very common, and has a bright yellow beak and a loud, tuneful song. It enjoys gardens with lawns and spends quite a lot of time searching for earthworms. The female is all brown with a weakly speckled breast. The male is all black.

- ▶ This small, compact bird has round, short wings and is usually the first to appear at the bird table, often scaring off other, bigger birds. It has a blue crown, wings and tail and yellow underparts.

- ▶ Noisy and aggressive, this is a large, showy bird with a long tail. Not everybody likes these birds. They are black and white and often eat the eggs of other birds.

- ▶ This small bird is often found near water. It has black upper parts, throat and breast, but a white forehead and face. Its long tail is in constant, wagging motion.
